

The Situation



Communities of data sharing partners have formed, brought together by specific needs.



Some are geographically based, but other types of data sharing communities also exist.

The Solution



Carequality creates a standardized, national-level interoperability framework to link all data sharing networks.



Carequality is creating a web of interconnected communities.

Essential Elements





Common rules of the road: In order for the varied participants to trust each other with health information, everyone needs to have a legal obligation to abide by the same rules.



Well-defined technical specs: Shared rules are not enough; clear standards must be laid out in an implementation guide that all implementers can follow.




A participant directory: To connect using the common standards, systems must know the addresses and roles of each participant.

Onboarding to Carequality - History



- 5/9/2016 the Coordinating Committee:
 - Determined eHx should participate in Carequality as an Implementer
 - Directed eHx to sign the Carequality Connected Agreement (CCA)
 - See OP&P 10

- 8/22/2018 Carequality Connected Agreement (CCA) signed
- 11/30/2019 DURSA Amended effective 2/1/2020 granting:
 - Coordinating Committee authority to enter network agreements
 - Participants' ability to opt-out for any reason

Carequality – Communication Coming




- Communication Elements:
 - a. Coordinating Committee entered into Carequality data sharing agreement
 - b. Carequality data sharing agreement and Connection Terms (flow-down) terms
 - c. Ability to opt-out for any reason through 3/31/2020
 - i. Email administrator@ehealthexchange.org
 - ii. Can change direction any time
 - d. eHealth Exchange's Carequality fee
 - e. Ability to begin transacting in Production as early as 2/1/2020
 - f. Pilot (non-Production) activities can continue past 1/31/2020
- 2. Distribute early-January 2020
- 3. Certain Participants they might want to opt-out of Carequality via the eHealth Exchange
 - a. CareEverywhere (e.g. all Epic Participants)
 - b. CommonWell (e.g. CommonSpirit)
 - c. Carequality Implementers: Santa Cruz HIO, CRISP, Womba, Konza, Manifest Medex, & MiHIN
